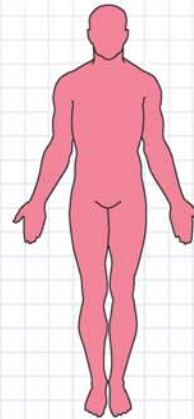

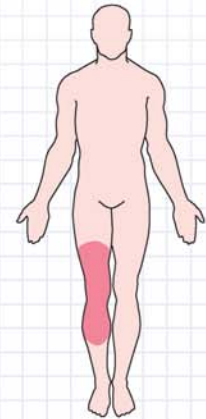
Is There Surgery in Your Future?

If so, you have a choice other than narcotic medications to relieve your pain after surgery. It's called the ACCUFUSER® Post-Op Pain Control Pump. A small, portable medical device, the ACCUFUSER pump relieves pain in the area of your surgery through local anesthesia, a technique similar to what dentists use to numb the mouth.

Using the ACCUFUSER pump, you'll have significantly less need for narcotic pain medications, which often cause unwanted side effects like nausea, drowsiness or constipation. You'll benefit from a faster, more comfortable recovery process.

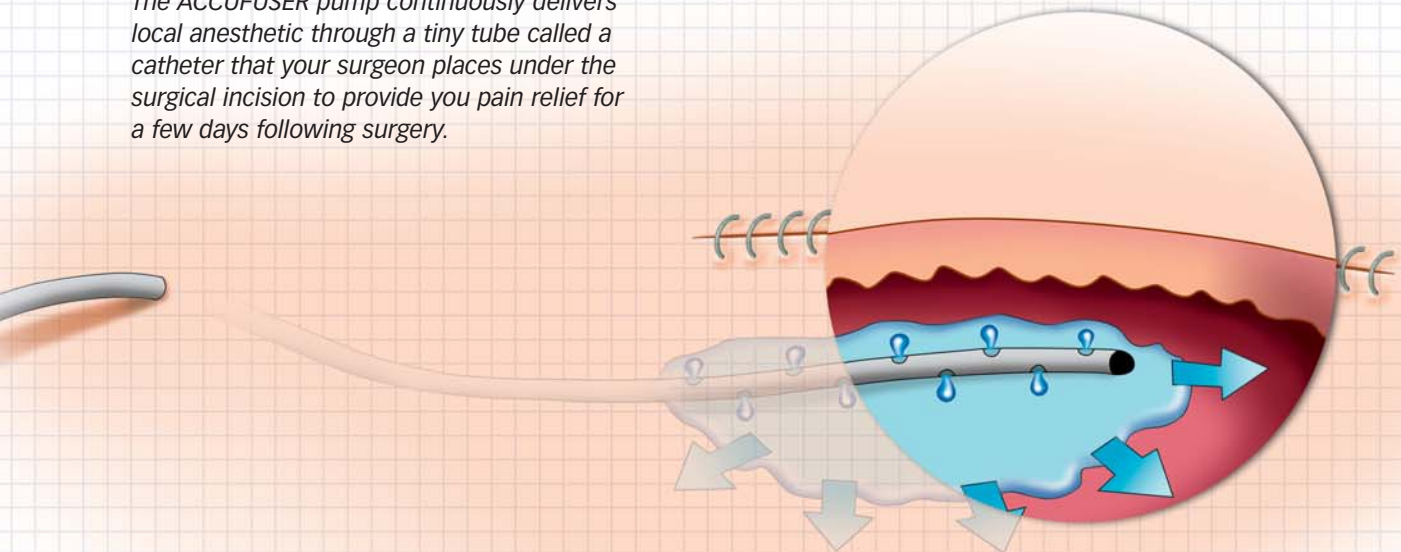


Narcotic pain medications affect your entire body, raising the risk of side effects.

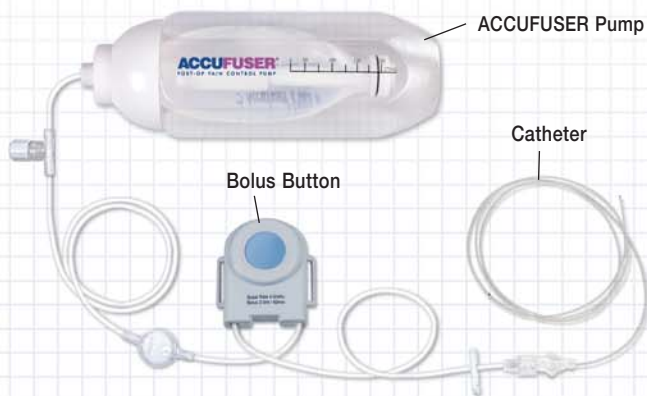


The ACCUFUSER pump delivers a non-narcotic local anesthetic directly to the surgical site, reducing the risk of side effects.

The ACCUFUSER pump continuously delivers local anesthetic through a tiny tube called a catheter that your surgeon places under the surgical incision to provide you pain relief for a few days following surgery.



A Preview of the ACCUFUSER Pump



The ACCUFUSER pump contains a balloon filled with a non-narcotic local anesthetic medication. It delivers the local anesthetic through a tiny tube called a catheter that the surgeon places under the surgical incision. The pump medicates the incision area continuously to provide you pain relief for a few days following surgery.

If prescribed by your surgeon, a bolus button feature allows you to deliver additional doses of the non-narcotic local anesthetic for more personalized pain control and greater comfort.



It's Safe and Simple to Use

During your procedure, the surgeon will insert the catheter under your surgical incision. Afterwards, the surgeon will connect the catheter to the ACCUFUSER pump and activate it. The pump will automatically deliver a continuous flow of non-narcotic local anesthetic to relieve your pain.



You may need extra relief before activities or during periods of increased pain. If so, just press the bolus button to deliver a dose of additional non-narcotic local anesthetic.

When medication delivery is complete, the catheter removes easily and the pump is discarded. Catheter removal may be performed by your surgeon or nurse, or they may instruct you on how to do it yourself.

Made of non-latex materials, the ACCUFUSER pump is safe and simple to use. The convenient carrying pouch lets you take it anywhere you go during recovery.

Once you've received your ACCUFUSER pump, you'll be given a phone number to call anytime you have a question or concern.
